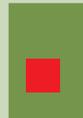

Presentation formats

- A 20-minute lecture, followed by 5 minutes of comments by a discussant, and 5 minutes for questions
- A 90-minute symposium focusing on one topic, comprising a number of short lectures and a discussion
- A poster displaying research or work-in-progress

Language of Presentation

Presentations may be in English or Hebrew

Evaluation criteria

Each proposal will be evaluated by at least two persons according to a blind-review process. The following criteria will guide the evaluations:

- The relevance to language assessment and evaluation;
- The contribution to the field of language testing and assessment;
- The extent to which the proposal is based on data;
- The clarity of expression of the proposal.

Submitting proposals

All proposals must be submitted electronically to Janine Woolfson at janine@nite.org.il by July 1st, 2008. If in English, they must be in Times New Roman 12 font, and double-spaced. If in Hebrew, they must be in David 12 font, and double-spaced. Submissions should be in the form of two Word documents:

1. The first document should give the authors' names and affiliations (as you would like them to appear on the program), as well as e-mail addresses and telephone numbers. It should also provide the title and the topic of the paper (see above).
2. The second document should be a double-spaced abstract (300 to 500 words) of your paper. The heading should consist of the title of your paper only. (Do not include the authors or institutional affiliations). In general, the abstract should include information on the objectives of the paper, the sources of information and the methods used, results, conclusions, and contribution of the paper to the field.

If your paper is accepted, you will be asked to provide a detailed summary of your paper to a discussant two weeks before the conference.

ACROLT will provide an overhead projector, computer and barco for each session. Presenters who wish to make use of the barco will be asked to send their PowerPoint file to Janine Woolfson at janine@nite.org.il three days before the conference.
